

## Blue Ridge Area Food Bank and 22 Area Schools Partner for 11<sup>th</sup> Annual School Food Drive

**VERONA, Va. (March 4, 2022) –** Next week, the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, along with 23 local schools, will kick off the annual School Food Drive in the greater Charlottesville region. In its 11<sup>th</sup> year, the drive will run from March 7-25.

The annual event boosts food supplies at the Food Bank during the spring when donations traditionally run low. The food collected will provide meals for roughly 23,000 individuals and families served by 38 Food Bank partner pantries—soup kitchens, shelters, and nonprofits—as well as Food Bank program distributions in the Charlottesville area.

Kat Ravichandran and Emily Warren of Albemarle High School are leading the efforts this year. The students are looking to build on momentum from the 2021 drive, which resulted in 8,300 pounds of food collected – the highest total collected since 2016, providing 7,000 meals for neighbors facing hunger.

"With students and families coming together to tackle food insecurity impacting our neighbors across the region, I'm excited to see all that we can accomplish this year," said Ravichandran. "This partnership with the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank and all the participating schools makes such a positive impact each year, and it's something my peers and I look forward to."

Since the School Food Drive's inception, participating schools have collected 73,367 pounds of food, providing 61,119 meals for families and individuals experiencing hunger. The impact proves that young people can and do make a difference in their communities.
