Solving hunger every day: Access to nutritious food, no matter where you live

Every day, countless actions across our network combine to sustain neighbors and transform lives and communities. Food Bank programs on wheels bring peace of mind to guests who would otherwise have a hard time accessing a food pantry.

For example, Mobile Food Pantries deliver food to neighbors in rural areas without access to a nearby grocery store. Neighborhood Produce Markets deliver fresh fruits and vegetables to neighbors who live in urban food deserts or who lack transportation. We also distribute food at Remote Area Medical (RAM) clinics to ease the burden of access for underinsured patients who visit the clinic to receive free healthcare.

From transportation to language to stigma, we are working hard to alleviate the hurdles faced by some of our guests in accessing our services. To achieve this goal, we continue to tap non-traditional partners and develop innovative food distribution models that reach underserved people, no matter where they live, work, or play. Your generosity enables us to bring nutritious food to schools, neighborhoods, health clinics, food pantries, community centers, and more.

Mobile Food Pantry:

The Mobile Food Pantry delivers fresh produce, protein, and nutritious staples to families, seniors, and children living in rural counties in the Blue Ridge region. This Food Bank program is about much more than just providing food for people—it's about ensuring that everyone, regardless of how rural they live, or if their town has a grocery store, has access to the nourishment they need to thrive.

Neighborhood Produce Markets:

These farmer's market-style produce distributions deliver needed groceries in underserved neighborhoods where access to fresh food is limited. Based on the location of each neighborhood, the Food Bank provides produce that suits the demographics of the neighborhood after assessing cultural preferences.

Remote Area Medical Clinics:

Remote Area Medical (RAM) is a national organization that provides free healthcare services through mobile pop-up clinics. RAM free clinics deliver quality health care services to underserved and uninsured individuals who do not have access to healthcare or cannot afford a doctor. The Food Bank partners with RAM to provide fresh produce and shelf stable items well-suited for patients.

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
