With Dignity and Purpose: Strengthening the Hunger Relief Network

Partner Impact & Innovation grants directly connect generous donors and the frontline partners who serve our neighbors every day. Through this annual program, food pantries, soup kitchens, shelters, and nutrition program partners access critical support to better serve their guests. Some grants support participation in the Health Pantry Initiative, a movement that guides pantries to implement more health-focused and neighbor-centered practices.

Thanks to donor support, since 2016 we've invested more than \$5.3 million in building the capacity and resilience of the food distribution network. Your donation fuels these investments, helping partners provide more food, with greater nutritional value, to more people. Together, we're building a more efficient, sustainable, and impactful hunger relief network.

An example of your generosity in action is currently in use at Park View Community Mission (Lynchburg). The addition of an electric pallet jack will make a significant difference in efficiency and operations.



Healthy Pantry Initiative: Building Capacity and Improving the Health and Well-Being of Guests


Food pantries can opt-in to participate in the Healthy Pantry Initiative (HPI), and this year, with funding from donors, 63 of all awardees received a grant to support their work specifically in one of four HPI categories: food availability, community connection, health education, and neighbor-centered practices.

Examples of awards include commercial coolers, freezers, shopping carts, awnings, tables, sheds, and technology upgrades, including translation tools to help volunteers connect and communicate with guests.
